

Questions Your Elmiron Lawyer May Ask You

① What Injury Have You Been Diagnosed With?

Many Elmiron users have developed vision problems, such as maculopathy (pigmentary or retinal) and macular degradation, as a result of their use of the product. However, you should speak with a medical professional to determine the extent of your vision problems.

② When Did the Vision Problems Start?

You'll want to speak with your attorney about when the problems started. Those who are filing lawsuits reported that their vision conditions started after using Elmiron for two years or within one year of stopping their use.

③ How Have Your Vision Problems Impacted Your Life?

Losing your vision is scary, and you've likely had a difficult time coming to terms with your condition. Emotional and mental pain is common amongst the other victims of Elmiron, so make sure to be honest about how your situation has affected your daily life. Remember, your attorney is in your corner, and they can ensure you're fairly compensated for the hardship that you've endured.

④ How Long Did You Use Elmiron?

The timeline of your diagnosis is essential to your case, so try to give as much detail as possible when speaking to your attorney. Typically, vision problems start to occur after two years of using Elmiron.

⑤ Are You Still Using Elmiron?

If you're still taking Elmiron, it's best to discuss with your doctor possible alternatives. No drug should rob you of your vision, especially one that's marketed as a harm reduction medication.

⑥ Have You Sought Treatment for Your Vision Problem? If So, What Kind?

Your attorney will want to know if you're using any medications or therapies to treat your vision problems. Not only will it help with your case, but the information will also let your attorney know that you're doing well and not still suffering from your condition.

⑦ Have You Had Any Other Eye Problems in the Past?

Your medical history will help your attorney move forward with your case. Make sure to let them know if you have a history of maculopathy, macular degradation, or any other vision conditions.
